**TIME LINE OF ACHIEVEMENTS: 1988 - 2018**

**After IHTECs closure past members of IHTEC are continuing the work of IHTEC and their ISPG's. To accommodate the follow up, Julia as Vice-President Education, Council on Global Issues (CGI) now houses the follow up of IHTEC and all its programs including the Global Sustainability Education (GSE) within the Council on Global Issues, registered as a Not For Profit.**

**INTRODUCTION**

1. 1988: October 23 - 27; Julia Morton travelled from Goolwa, South Australia, to attend the International Institute for Peace Through Tourism (IIPT) "First Global Conference - Tourism as a Vital Force for Peace" held in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. In December 1988 she returned from South Australia to live in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada.
2. 1988: October 25; George Kibedi International Consultants. Julia met at the International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) conference "Tourism as a Vital Force Peace" held in Vancouver, B.C. Canada.
3. 1988: December 19; George Keibidi, World Tourism Organization, emailed Ms. Morton to thank her re the paper called "Method of Co-Operation with government for progress on land use and environmental issues". Julia thanked him from Goolwa, South Australia, Australia.
4. 1988: December 13, Julia returned to live with Fraser Marr, in Mississauga, Ontario

Canada. During the next few years she continued studying Tourism and Peace.

1991

5. 1991, Julia Morton-Marr had completed an un-published core-curriculum paper called “Holistic Tourism Education” via the distance education using UNIX through the University of Toronto for her Bachelor of Education (B.Ed) at the University of South Australia. The outcome of this paper showed an urgent need for an another paper that could be called ‘Education into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century’ with a focus involving the global commons, especially with the changes expected due to sea-level rise and the greenhouse effect due to climate change. {Academic papers projected a problem with sea level rise, as early 1976 (Graefe A. R.) and again in 1983 (Hoffman J S, Keyes D, Titus J G)}. The outcome of this research was the “School Peace Gardens”
6. The School Peace Gardens concept began on Julia Morton-Marr’s kitchen table in Mississauga. It was developed out of three aspects:
  - a. Julia’s 18 years of Junior Primary teaching and Music Consulting with the Education Department of South Australia and in the Northern Territory,
  - b. Julia’s previous studies (1985-1988) on a local - global micro-cosm on Sir Richard Peninsula, Goolwa, South Australia. This was done with as part of geography of tourism and urban planning research at the University of South Australia with John Braendler.
  - c. Ideas on Peace Through Tourism from attending the IIPT First Global Conference on Peace Through tourism. The combined result was developed into a ‘core’ curriculum for training teachers into “Education into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century” as a document which was sent to the University of South Australia. This was done on early computers on UNIX through the University of Toronto. This was before the world wide web.
7. 1991: Julia took the idea of School Peace Gardens, where the focus was on the environment, inter-cultural understanding, tourism as a vital force for peace, to the librarian at Ontario Institute of Studies in Education at the University of Toronto. They sent her to the Etobicoke Board of Education, when the Director sent her on to visit Eric Foster, Principal of West Humber Collegiate Institute, Etobicoke, Ontario which was the first Environmental Secondary High School, in Canada.
8. 1991: At West Humber Collegiate Institute, Eric Foster and his staff decided to establish the first ‘School Peace Garden’ between the bus stop and the front door of the school. The grove of 12 trees represented the 12 Provinces and Territories across Canada. Along with two ‘Friendship Benches’ and the ‘Path of peace” it helped to reduce the violence and vandalism by 60% over the next 6 months. This was done as ‘infusion’ education, which said, ‘This school is a place of peace’.
9. 1991: Early discussions with Evergreen Foundation who were focussed on school ground naturalization by digging up concrete, nurturing the soil and teaching teachers and students to plant native species. Julia suggested to the founder Lindsay Taylor, that they needed to consider including urban planning in all aspects of their work.

1992

10. 1992: Annual; Julia was involved with the IIPT, with their project 'PEACE PARKS ACROSS CANADA' which resulted in 400 dedicated Peace Parks in Municipalities. Each Park or Garden consists of a grove of 12 trees representing Canada's 10 provinces and 2 territories.
11. 1992: October 8; Julia was present for the opening ceremony of the 'Reconciliation: The Peacekeeping Monument' in Ottawa, Ontario, Canada. The monument was tribute to the Canadian men and women who serve as international peacekeepers and to Canada's commitment to world peace. The entire project was sponsored by the Department of National Defence and the National Capital Commission.
12. 1992: October ??; Julia Morton-Marr's planted a first peace tree for the International School Peace Gardens program (ISPG) program was planted at St. Peter's Church, Erindale **Mississauga**, Ontario, with Rev. Stephen Booth and Rev Jennifer Reid and the children of the Sunday School. The existing tree was donated by historian Tommy Adamson. Many people who visited the church from all over the world, have connected with the ISPG program and taken it home to their country.
13. 1992: November 16; Julia Morton-Marr, presented her water concepts to the 'Waterfront Regeneration Trust' for the 'Lake Ontario Greenway Strategy' from IIPT Peace Parks Across Canada and from Julia's education for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Julia used the term 'Watershed Peace Pathways' later as a program under the IHTEC methodology for protecting water pollution and conservation.

1993

14. 1993: March 2; Julia Morton-Marr was invited by the 'Waterfront Regeneration Trust' to a workshop on "Peace Parks: Opportunities in the Lake Ontario Greenway" located in Toronto on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1993. Loius D'Amore, President of the International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) conducted the workshop for representative of municipalities, conservation authorities, other agencies, and non-governmental organizations to explore opportunities to dedicate peace parks in Lake Ontario Greenway.
15. 1993: April 16 to 17; Julia Morton-Marr was invited to the 1993 Annual General Meeting and Symposium by Ontario Research Council on Leisure at Brock University/ Parkway Suites St. Catherine's, Ontario, Canada.
16. 1993: June; Julia Morton-Marr, Eric Foster, Heather Goodson at West Humber Collegiate Institute further developed the School Peace Gardens program with students of York University, Faculty of Environmental Studies, were involved during the summer.
17. 1993: September; 'School Peace Gardens' in included in the "Teyoyagon Revisited - A Field Guide to the Humber Valley" produced by the students of York University and Staff of West Humber. Staff at West Humber also produced lessons plans as part of the School Peace Gardens concept.

1994

18. 1994: February 15; The launch of Ontario's Environmental Bill of Rights (EBR), a Peace Tree was presented to the Premier, the Hon. Robert (Bob) Rae, linking the EBR to the

- School Peace Gardens. Eric Foster held at West Humber Collegiate Institute, Etobicoke, Ontario, Canada. The EBR was the first of its kind in the world. . Julia was introduced to Premier Bob Rae.
19. 1994: March 8; Submission to Etobicoke Board of Education re the ISPG program with Eric Foster, Principal West Humber Collegiate Institute. See booklet.
  20. 1994: July 18; B'nai Brith Canada, a Jewish Volunteer organization that defends human rights, fights racism, bigotry, and anti-Semitism, stated that they support the 'SchoolPeace Garden Project' based on the information package from IIPT Peace Parks across Canada detailing the project which was provided by Julia.
  21. 1994: August; Visited Auckland, New Zealand and distributed ISPG brochures to elementary school teachers at a conference at the Auckland hotel where I stayed. Held a meeting with Tourism Professor Chris Ryan, from Canada.
  22. 1994: It was then suggested to Julia by Eric Foster and his staff, that Julia apply to the UN/50 Canadian Committee for the Fiftieth Anniversary of the United Nations (UNAC), to be part of the United Nations Day in Schools in 1994-95
  23. 1994: September 27; The IIPT School Peace Gardens project was registered with the UN/50 Canadian Committee for the Fiftieth Anniversary of the United Nations. It was immediately approved on September 28 by Gary Sealey at UNAC in Ottawa. Now the work began of connecting with all the Canadian Government educational Ministries and School Boards. See letters of support. Early discussions continued with Eric Foster, Louis J. D'Amore, indicating that we should invite schools in Canada to dedicate an existing garden or plant a new one as a peace garden. A registration form, suggested dedication ceremony and curriculum content was included with the first kit of teacher resource materials. The project was accepted and UNAC published an article in the resource pages of the three "UNAC Day in Schools" booklets that went to every school in Canada.
  24. 1994: Kathryn M. Missert, the coordinator of International School Peace Gardens in the New York State, sent a proposal for the request of grant money to help fund IHTEC to help spread the work of the International School Peace Garden Project in Canada and other parts of the world.
  25. 1994: August - September; Travelled in New South Wales, and South Australia distributing brochures and talking to teachers. A number of these schools planted a peace garden.
  26. 1994: Prior to the SECOND GLOBAL CONFERENCE the School Peace Gardens had gone to Auckland, New Zealand; Salt Lake City, Utah, USA; Horse Cave, Kentucky, USA; London, England; Jerusalem, Israel; Ghana, West Africa; St. Michael, Barbados; and Ljubljana, Slovenia.
  27. 1994; September 12-16; Julia was honoured as "A Person Making a Difference" at the IIPT Second Global Conference in Montreal, Quebec. Also, Julia did a presentation at the conference. The first 'Teachers Resources' booklet was written for this event and Julia took 200 copies to the conference. All 200 went to people from 35 Countries, where it became the "International School Peace Gardens" at this time. Many of these people were in Canada and the USA. Following the Second Global Conference - Building a Sustainable World Through Tourism. The "International School Peace Gardens' project" went with committed Tourism for Peace participants to another 26 Countries. These include 22

- additional Canadian sites, covering British Columbia, University of Ottawa: Quebec; Yukon; Alberta; 15 sites in USA; 2 sites in Australia, New South Wales and Victoria; Thailand; 3 sites in Africa; Jordan; United Kingdom; Turkey; Japan; Nicaragua; Nassau, Bahamas; Mexico; Hungary; 2 sites in India; Bulgaria; China; Austria; Jamaica; Gibraltar; Saudi Arabia; Brazil; Barbados; Lebanon; Nigeria and Cameroon. Other people at the conference who didn't have business cards also have the materials. The IIPT paid for Julia's Conference fees and accommodation.
28. 1994: Michele Sararas, University of Guelph, Ontario, was introduced to Julia because she wrote a paper "Tourist Motivation & Need Fulfilment Research Report" by the tourism Dean Michael Haywood. The Dean suggested Julia to mentor Michele.
  29. Michelle Sararas, student at the University of Guelph, completed her worked with IHTEC (1994-2005). She was an acting board member in the non-governmental Organization, she continued to contact school principles and teachers for support. She worked on the ISPG program where she aimed to raise global awareness at conferences, promoting safety in schools and global peace through education.
  30. 1994: September 23 - 27: The ISPG project was presented by Veronica Long, to the 250 participants at the 23rd Annual Conference of the National American Association for Environmental Education, in Cancun, Mexico. The Village of Puerto Morelos in Mexico dedicated their village as a Millennium project at the Montreal conference, also planted a peace grove in their town centre. This required some interesting methods to create holes in the limestone.
  31. 1994: October 8; Julia Morton-Marr gave a speech representing Peace Parks across Canada (PPAC) and International Institute for Peace through Tourism (IIPT) in the City of Kitchener at Victoria Parks. The event dedicated three trees as part of PPAC. People attending the event, Dr. Koch, University of Guelph professor, spoke and handed out one hundred small peace trees to everyone in attendance. Julia took hers to St. Peters Erindale Anglican Church which became the first peace tree of International School Peace Gardens (ISPG)
  32. 1994: October 24; One of the NEW United Nations Association of Canada's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary 'Day in Schools' program, was then the Peace Parks Across Canada's - School Peace Gardens' which was initiated by the Julia Morton-Marr and Eric Foster with the International Institute for Peace through Tourism. The project was linked with over 400 Municipal National and Provincial Peace Parks Across Canada. School Peace Gardens, first was developed at West Humber Collegiate institute, Etobicoke, Ontario, Canada, and is linked to the Secondary School Mediation strategy and the World's first 'Environmental Bill of Rights, launched by the Ontario Ministry of Environment and Energy'.
  33. 1994: November 8; Superintendent John Horton invited Julia to present "School Peace Gardens" project to the National Committee for the United Nations 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, Day In Schools, at North York Board of Education.
  34. 1994: November 8; Julia Morton-Marr, co-founder of IHTEC, introduced 'Peace Parks Across Canada – School Peace Gardens Project' proposal as part of the International institute for Peace through Tourism at the 'United Nations 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary' in Ottawa. She presented the proposal at UN to the Committee for Education and Public Awareness

in Toronto, ON, Canada.

35. Letters of support came from the Australian Parliament's, Leader of the Opposition, The Hon. Alexander Downer, who since 1985 knew of Julia's research in South Australia. Other letters were from British Airways; Ghanaian Canadian Multicultural Association; Ontario Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Recreation; Mobray College, Victoria, (one of the first ISPG schools in Australia and Hazel McCallion, Mayor of the City of Mississauga.

1995

36. 1995: February 13; Received a letter from "The International Oceanographic Foundation" at the School of Marine and Atmospheric Science in Miami, Florida, received pursuing the "Marine Peace Garden" Project. We decided to call this educational program 'Marine Peace Parks.'
37. 1995: May 28; Eric Foster and Julia Morton-Marr held a meeting to consider hosting the International School Peace Gardens as a separate Educational Charity to be called 'International Holistic Tourism Education Centre - IHTEC'. This involved a legal letter to separate from the IIPT.
38. 1995: May 6-10, We then had to change the ISPG nomination with the UNAC 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee. The same day Julia attended a meeting of the UN Day in Schools 50<sup>th</sup> programs with the Canadian Committee for the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the United Nations. The meeting was Chaired by John Horton, Superintendent, North York Board of Education for their Director, Veronica Lacey. At this time ISPG was supported by all Ministries of Education across Canada, Canadian Association of Principals, Canadian Teacher's Federation and Canadian School Boards Association. 350 schools across Canada dedicated ISPG's on UN Day in Schools, October 24, 1995.
39. 1995: April 20, Mickey Masuda, Soka Gakki International, Toronto, Ontario, took and introduced Julia to the committee on for the 'Inter-disciplinary Conference on the Evolution of World Order committee'. The meeting was held in Annatol and Gwen Rapport's home in Toronto. Here Julia met committee members Prof. Anatol Rapoport, Chair of Peace Studies; Prof. Helmut Burkhardt, Faculty of Physics, Ryerson University. Helmut was also Head of the 'Ryerson Energy Centre' from 1979-1984; Many of these professors were members of Science for Peace. Science for Peace, which was co-founded in 1981 at University of Toronto, by Prof. Derek Paul and Prof. Eric Fawcett, who attended. Also at this meeting were Dr. Walter Dorn; Mr. Michael Greenspoon, Ms Helen Izumi (SGI), Dr. Anne D'Andrea; Shirley Farlinger, Mr. Mickey Masuda; Lynn Holden, Egyptologist; and Prof. Terry Gardiner, Mathematics, Uni of Toronto. This committee met regularly working on the very important series of conferences called "The Evolution of World Order". This vital academic group studied the long term affects on global issues. They represented nine friendly local non-governmental organizations in the Greater Toronto Area. These were Science for Peace, The International Society for Systems Science; Canadian Division Soka Gakkai International; Calendon Centre for Culture and Education; Ryerson Polytechnic University, Faculty of Engineering and Applied Science; United Nations Association in Canada, Toronto Chapter; Millennium Council of Canada;

- and the Canadian Voice of Women for Peace. Anatol's lovely wife Gwen was a blessing as she prepared their home, made many cups of tea and coffee and deliver cake for all of us, and cleaned up afterwards.
40. Soon afterwards Prof Helmut Burkhardt joined the IHTEC Board and Julia joined Science for Peace, University of Toronto, Ontario, Canada.
  41. 1995 : June 8 - 10; The Fourth Canadian Conference on Foundation and Applications of General Science Theory was held at Ryerson Polytechnic University Toronto, Ontario, Canada. The honorary conference chair, Anatol Rapoport, along with Helmut Burkhardt discussed on the "Knowledge Tools for a Sustainable Civilization". Julia attended and contributed during discussions.
  42. 1995: Event with Canada Remembers at Queens Parks. Contacts: Serge Rainville, Executive Director, Canada Remembers Tel: (613)947-3837 also Karyn Leonard, Director Interparliamentary and Public Relations Branch. Tel: (416)325-7500
  43. 2005: 24 October; UN/50 Day in Schools Dedication of Gardens and Millennium Projects.
  44. 1995: June 24; Michele Sararas. Julia was invited to give a workshop "Our Dreams For the Millennium - Year 2000" The Dream Bench.
  45. 1995: Petri Kukkola, Graphic Artist, Archon Design + Communication, who has great talent, spent 5 hours listening and designed the delightful and meaningful ISPG logo. Some time later he developed logos for water, marine, creatures, and IHTEC all with the leaf for peace in them.
  46. 1995: Ministry of Education requested 8000 copies of the ISPG brochure to be added into the UNESCO 'Rescue Mission' document. IHTEC produced this, but later had to pick them up at their Government distribution office, because the UNESCO document was not ready in time.
  47. 1995: The United Nations Associations in Canada produced and published three booklets:
    - a. "Fifty Years At The United Nations" for Grades 4 -6
    - b. "Where to go from here? The UN at 50." for Grades 7 -8.
    - c. "Looking Back, Looking Forward" for Grades 10 - 12.
    - d. IHTEC's ISPG program was included in the Day in Schools and at the back of all documents in the Resources section, with our early email and some errors by UNAC.
  48. 1995: Fraser Elementary School Canberra, ACT, Australia was first school to celebrate the UN 50th with a Dedication Ceremony in the ISPG program. They made their school a "Peace Park".
  49. 1995: Michael Wheeler plants first Canadian ISPG at Notre Dame Secondary School in the Dufferin - Peel Catholic School Board Brampton, Ontario, Canada.
  50. 1995; August 16<sup>th</sup>; International School Peace Gardens, Original Master copy of "Resources for Teachers", booklet was developed with the help of Marleen for the "United Nations Day in Schools". It contains the objectives, the history, the provincial emblems, and ideas on how to use the School Peace Gardens, for dedicating their Peace Garden on October 24<sup>th</sup>.
  51. 1995: September 2; Met Chancellor Robert Muller, who wrote in his 'Dream Diary'
    - a. "Idea 419 ~ Today, as part of the Great Millennium Campaign of the City of Toronto in Canada, a lady, Mrs. Julia Morton-Marr informed me that she will start

an association to create children's peace gardens in as many schools as possible around the world, and that in each such garden she wants to see a bench of dreams built. Well, this will give a new dimension to the number of benches of dreams built so far: in my peace park in Costa Rica, at the Casa de Maria in Santa Barbara, California, and at the St. Francis University in Sao Paulo, Brazil.”

52. 1995: September. 17, UN50th “Spirit of the Earth Young People’s Inter-Faith Celebration” Credit Valley Park. Organized by Michael Wheeler and Julia with the St. Peter’s Church inter-faith committee.
53. 1995: September; International School Peace Gardens is mentioned in an article which states that the organization plans to be a part of the UN 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary. See public relations article in CSBAction September 1995 edition page 8. CSBAction is published quarterly by ‘The Canadian School Boards Association.
54. 1995; September 15; Roy Cadwell sent Julia Morton-Marr a copy of the 25 Years of Peace - History of the Lester B. Pearson Peace Park, on Trans-Canada Highway No. 7 Tweed, Ontario.
55. 1997: October 16; Andy Wickens, President of Ontario Parks Association, confirms to work in collaboration and partnership with IHTEC to propel the ISPG program to national and international stature.
27. IHTEC also arranged to promote the ‘Ontario Environmental bill of Rights’. It was also suggested that ISPG should be a ‘Strategy for Safer Schools’. A total of 350 schools registered their schools for the UN/50. See registration folders.
56. 1995: Spoke to Mississauga Rotary Club.
57. 1995: Spoke to Oakville Rotary Club at a restaurant, in Oakville, Ontario. (Just off the Hwy 403/QEW)
58. 1995: St. Michael’s School, Turnerville, 165 Sewell Drive, Oakville, Ontario, L6H 1E3 dedicated.
59. 1995: October; Julia Morton-Marr attended the Global Perspective Project.
60. 1995: A VIP letter from the Ontario Minister of Education, John C. Snobelen was sent for the celebrations on the United Nations 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. The letter stated that materials on the accomplishments of the United Nations were sent from the ministry to all principals along with a pamphlet on the “International School Peace Gardens” in hopes that these materials would support the learning outcomes in *The Common Curriculum* that focus on citizenship and global awareness.

1996

61. 1996: Julia met Laure Abou-Jaude and Anne D’Andrea at a UN 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Conference at OISE, University of Toronto.
62. 1996; Dedication by Michael Wheeler and 13 schools covering Secondary and Elementary Schools, plant an ISPG at Heart Lake Community Peace Garden and Picnic Area, Brampton, Ontario.
63. 1996; Several teachers at the West Humber Collegiate Institute developed a booklet for secondary school teachers, under the guidance of principle, Eric Foster and Heather



- Goodman. The booklet titled; International School Peace Gardens, A Collection of Lesson Plans.
64. 1996: January; Ontario Parks Association promotes the program in Ontario, in Canada and the World Parks Association.
  65. 1996: March 23; Julia met Robert Muller, retired Assistant Secretary General, at the United Nations, at University of Toronto during the UN 50<sup>th</sup> celebration. During the millennium, Julia sent information to the United Nations University of Peace in Costa Rica (to Robert) about the ISPG program. He responded saying, “please use the bench of dreams, on which students are invited to dream of solutions to current local issues and concerns”. IHTEC combined that concept with friendship as part of the International School Peace Gardens. He wrote about Julia’s work, ISPG, in his “3000 Ideas and Dreams for a Better World, Media 21, Santa Barbara, California.   66. 1996: March 25 -26, OPA Seminar Trade Show presents ISPG to Municipal Parks and many other organizations.
  67. 1996: April 13; Julia wrote to Dunblane Primary School, Scotland, U.K. after the shooting to encourage teachers to plant a “Peace Garden” as part of their recovery.
  68. 1996: June 20; Julia Morton-Marr, Director of ISPG, began collaboratively working with the Caribbean Youth Environment in Bridgetown, Barbados.
  69. 1996: September 19: Julia promoted ISPG widely as Secretary of the Millennium Council of Canada Board.
  70. 1996: May 11-12; CANEXUS 11: The Canoe in Canadian Cultures, Frost Centre, Trent University, Peterborough, Ontario, Canada. Here Julia met Kirk Whipper, James Raffan, John Jennings, where Kirk Whipper donated all his International & Canadian collection of canoes. This began the Canadian Canoe Museum. Kirk is a Professor, a great river man and elder, who always protected rivers and fresh water. Julia also met a team of water educators at the conference including Michael Greco, who was the first person to see what Julia had developed as an ‘Education into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century’ for Climate Change.. Mike supported the beginnings of the International School Peace Gardens, and the Watershed Peace Pathways. Around this time was when the term “International Holistic Tourism Education Centre (IHTEC) was conceived.
  71. 1996; April 13-14; President of IHTEC, Julia Morton-Marr, presented the IHTEC’s Millennium Projects, Promoting Safety in Schools and Global Peace through Education, at the Inaugural Meeting of the “World Year 2000 and Millennium Meeting”, UN University For Peace in Costa Rica. The objective of the presentation was:
    - a. To operate a resource centre for ‘Holistic Tourism Education’ with a focus on contributions from educators around the world.
    - b. To collect, research, analyze and develop materials that foster healthy and nonviolent communities through ‘Holistic Tourism Education’
    - c. To train educators in ‘Holistic Tourism Education’ fostering a “Culture of Peace”

82. 1997: February 7; Julia was invited to a "Tourism University Consortium Meeting" to focus on an inter-disciplinary University collaboration for "Tourism Education into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century" held at the University of Guelph, Arboretum. Michael Haywood, Guelph University, Dr. Gordon Nelson, Waterloo University attended.
83. 1997: February 12; An annual meeting was held for IHTEC at the Ontario Parks

- Association Board room to discuss the overall agenda of the organization.
84. 1997: February 26; Julia was invited to speak to the University Women's Club, St George Street, Toronto, ON by Shirley Farlinger who said "Your work is so important, I'm looking forward to the recognition you richly deserve."
  85. 1997: March 7; Julia was one of the organizers for a "Tourism University Consortium Meeting" to focus on an Inter-disciplinary University collaboration for "Tourism Education Into the 21<sup>st</sup> Century". Julia organized alongside Professor Gordon Nelson of Heritage Resources Centre, and Professor Michael Haywood of University of Guelph.

  90. 1997: April 27; Julia received a letter from Larry Kearns a teacher from St. Agnes School which stated that on April 26<sup>th</sup>, 1997 over 150 volunteers gathered at the school to create the School Peace Garden.
  91. 1997: Met Manuela Godinho, at a Canadian Voice of Women for Peace (VOW) conference and they decided to work together as educators. Manuela and Janis Alton had attended the Fourth World Conference on Women: Action for Equality, Development and Peace, convened by the United Nations during 4–15 September 1995 in Beijing, China.
  92. 1997: June 4; Julia Morton-Marr (IHTEC) organized and held an event as part of the Millennium Council of Canada at City Hall which included Paula Savage as a speaker from the Peace Garden Foundation from Washington DC. Paula dedicates peace gardens at an ambassadorial level around the world. This was part of the Millennium Council of Canada Media Event to Welcome the World Peace Caravan in Toronto, Canada, with the World Citizen Diplomats "Peace 2000 Caravan" with Peace Pilgrim 2.
  93. 1997; June 6 - 8; The 1st Interdisciplinary Conference on the evolution of World Order (EWOC) Building a Foundation for Peace in the Third Millennium.   100. 1997: October 24-25; Julia Morton Marr and Eric Forter, founders of IHTEC, were invited by Denyse Morrissey, Ex. Director, OPA & University of Guelph to talk about ‘Holistic Tourism Education’ and ISPG at the “Helping Kids Grow: Peace Gardens and Naturalization in your School Yard” conference at University of Guelph, Ridgetown College in Ridgetown, Ontario, Canada.

110. 1998: February 20; Julia wrote a letter to Eric Foster and IHTEC Board members to find out if we could start a "Project for Israel, Lebanon and Syria" as part of "The Millennium Peace Project". Julia was in Brisbane when she wrote this letter.
111. 1998: March; Participated in the London Ontario, 'Safe Schools Trade Show' where Julia met Dr. Fred Mathews at this event, who felt that the ISPG program was the best positive program he had seen.
112. 1998: March 11 - 15, Ontario Parks Association (OPA) builds an ISPG at Canada Blooms. Over 10,000 people attended. Denyse Morrisey and OPA team did a wonderful job at promoting the ISPG program. St. Kevin's sent 50 students (gradeS 2-8) to sing for the opening. Lots of photos were taken of this event including the student painted large windows. Julia presented award pins to the children and their teacher. Article page 1, Green Sward magazine, March 1998.
113. 1998: April 7; Julia Morton-Marr attended the "Forest Valley Outdoor Education Center" conference which was sponsored by "The Periwinkle Project" and supported by the Toronto District School Board. At the conference she met several speaker; Ian Morton (Lung Association), Henry Kock (Guelph University Arboretum), and Cam Collyer (Evergreen Foundation). All speakers talked about different perspectives; Health, Ecological, and Practical, when thinking about introducing trees into the environment.
114. 1998: April 18; Julia spoke at the Toronto Rotary Urban Peace Conference held at Ryerson University, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. Julia was requested by Dr. Fred Mathews, Psychologist of Toronto Youth Services, to speak. 115. 1998: March 23; Julia wins the Elaine Burke Award for ISPG presented by the Ontario Parks Association.
116. 1998: March 23, Operation Green Leaves, Haiti and Miami 4000 children focus on Environmental Education and planting peace trees.
117. 1998: On behalf of the Leisure Services Department of City of Sudbury there was a Millennium office established. The office provided information to the school boards and invited the community in Sudbury to participate in the International School Peace Garden.
118. 1998: May 4; The launch of one of a series of Millennium programs initiated by IHTEC occurred at “The Canadian Heritage Rivers Conference – Conserving and Restoring Our River Heritage” located at the Delta Vancouver Airport Hotel, British Columbia, Canada. Mark Angelo, of Canadian Heritage Rivers Board, received the first “Watershed Peace Pathways” Pioneer award by the president of the Canadian River Management Society, Michael Greco, also a partner with IHTEC.
119. 1998: May 12, Paula Savage of the International Peace Garden Foundation (USA) promoted Julia’s development of the ISPG in Ottawa. It was hosted by The High Commissioner for South Africa, The Canadian Tulip Festival and the City of Ottawa. We held a trade show table and gave out folders to Ambassadors of nine countries. The Hungarian Ambassador suggested that IHTEC inform all the Ambassadors in Canada and at the United Nations.
120. 1998: May 13, Mike Greco launched “Watershed Peace Pathways- WPP” Stage 2 in IHTEC’s ISPG programs at the Canadian River Management Society (CRMS) and River Management Society (RMS) Conferences held in Vancouver and Alaska.
121. 1988: May 13; Julia launched the “Watershed Peace Pathways (WPP) Stage 2 program at St. Agnes Catholic School, Chatham, Ontario, Canada.
122. 1998: May 26-27; Julia met Robert Muller founder of the University for Peace, in Costa Rica, at University of Toronto, Ontario Studies in Education (OISE). They discussed his written paper on “Globalization and the Fate of the Nation-State – The Next Development of the International System. The Absolute Urgent Need for Proper Earth Government”. This paper was presented at the International Roundtable of the Gorbachev Foundation, the Club of Budapest and the Grauso Foundation on Globalization and the Future of the Nation-State in Caligari, Sardinia. Robert Muller was an Assistant to United Nations Secretary General.

  130. 1998: September 17 & 18; IHTEC received the ‘1997 Award of Recognition’ from the Ontario Parks Association, for participation in Community Parks Week.
  131. 1998: October 20; ISPG formerly attended the inauguration ceremony of the John XXIII Catholic School Peace Garden in Unionville, Ontario, Canada. At the event the work of the students involved in the peace garden project was highlighted and honoured guests such as Julia Morton-Marr (founder of ISPG), were welcomed for the celebration of the official launch of the school’s Peace Garden. The event was organized by the John XXIII committee which included Yvonne Brathwaite and others.

YMCA Peace Medal was awarded Julia Morton-Marr. Julia was nominated by Douglas Moore of Buckman Laboratory. Directors were with Julia to receive the YMCA Canadian Peace Medal in **Mississauga**. The nomination by Douglas Moore, was to support all the hard work for so many people around IHTEC.

135. 1998: December 21, Mexican children send 13,000 Christmas Cards with five Government Secretaries to Canada. Later another 2000 cards arrived. The Mexico-Canada Children's Connection Christmas Card Exchange was organized by Teresa Prieto R. of the Mexico - Canada Professional Group.
136. 1998; December ; Newsletter saying that Paula Savage, President of the International Peace Garden Foundation, Washington D. C, USA was coming to visit Toronto to meet Julia, as she was the only person who have developed a curriculum for School Peace Gardens.

137. 1999: January 2; Julia was invited by Michael Ellis, president of Conference Earth, to be involved in two major conferences in Melbourne, Australia; "The Search for Humanity", to be held in September 2000 for an estimated 150 delegates and "Concert of Love" to be held in the year 2003. 140. 1999: February 4; Julia spoke to the East York Rotary Club, Watts Restaurant, Eglinton Square Shopping Mall, Ontario, Canada re the work of IHTEC and the role of Rotary.
141. 1999: February 23, IHTEC President Julia Morton-Marr delivered greeting cards from students in Mexico to an assembly of 80 students at the Gordon Graydon Memorial Secondary School in **Mississauga**, Ontario. Julia also spoke about Peace and Environmental issues and how they react together. The 'State of the World Lesson Plan' was developed for these secondary school students, who produced a report as a result.

As an example of a call to action, we had a skype conference with Symbiosis Law School, Noida in New Delhi, India. The purpose was to answer questions about reforestation initiatives benefiting the environment. This simple act of communication inspired the school to create their own reforestation project. We encourage our supporters such as the Association for Women Waorani, of Ecuador not only to plant trees, but to structure the best use of their skills. In this case, the tribal women trained young adults in traditional handicraft skills of their local area so that they are discouraged from relying on deforestation as a primary source of income. We are also proud to announce the planting of 10,000 trees in Madagascar, not a small feat!
